## Six Ways Airports are improving Safety

he aviation industry takes airport safety and security very seriously. But this mindset can lead to excessive wait times and significant frustration for travelers. Fortunately, there are many changes in the works, as technology advances aim to make the airport experience smoother and faster. Here are six ways airports are improving their safety measures while becoming easier to use.

#### 1. Powerful body scanners

One safety measure going through the trial stage is a very powerful walk-though passenger scanner that can recognize potential hidden threats without passengers needing to stay still or remove items of clothing. The system was recently tested at Cardiff Airport and has the potential to not only improve security but also speed up the entire passenger security process.

The scanner images people's body heat and utilizes computer learning to tell the difference between something that is a threat and something that is not without passengers having to stop or stand still.

#### 2. Countering drones

Drones flying around airports (which we're increasingly seeing) not only cause disruptions but also potentially very serious security risks. An incident at Gatwick Airport in late 2018 showed how much chaos can be caused by a single drone flying near an airport. Unsurprisingly then, aviation authorities are looking at various options to deal with the issue. The many possibilities include enforcing stricter regulation over the drone industry as a whole or even forcing drones to comply with geofencing, where internal GPS stops the drone from entering restricted areas.

#### 3. The introduction of e-passports

E-passports are one of the major large-scale airport security advances in recent years. E-passports (also known as biometric passports) have been rolled out across the UK, with the first one issued way back in 2010. All new British passports are issued in this format, so it certainly appears to be here to stay.

The passports contain a chip that can be scanned by automatic machines at airports around the world. This significantly reduces the amount of work that has to be carried out by airport staff. These passport chips also eliminate the possibility of human error in the process, ensuring that airport security runs not only faster, but safer too.

#### 4. Facial recognition software

Facial recognition software is one of the new security features that many of us are already familiar with. For

However, this process is only in its infancy. A related innovation would enable a person to check in, drop off bags, and even board a flight without

#### 5. Physical security measures

In the rush to become more technologically advanced, airports must still continue to invest in the proper physical security measures required to keep passengers and staff safe at all times.

"Every project has its own specific requirements that need consideration to achieve the safety and security of the construction personnel and the public," says security and safety contractors Maltaward. "The industry is required to meet compliance with the strict airport codes of practice."

#### 6. Terahertz screening

Terahertz screening is another important technology that has the potential to revolutionize the airport industry. British business Thruvision is at the cutting edge of this technology, which works by sensing heat emissions from an individual's body to visualize hidden objects.

Some have suggested that this could present a health risk; however, Thruvision has argued that the devices do not use artificial illumination, which makes them safe.

The FRSC Boss emphasised that night trip which is often characterised by poor visibility, fatigue, sleeping on wheels, excessive speed among others is not only unsafe but utterly dangerous.

According to Bisi Kazeem, the Corps Public Education Officer, Oyeyemi gave the warning while reacting to some reports of fatal crashes recorded at night at the beginning of the year, which led to the death of several road users and left others with different degrees of injuries.

### Covid-19: How safe are we in Pubic Transport

igeria, 1 i k e countries around the world, have been battling the scourge of covid-19 for about one year now, recording deaths, and still counting.

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a contagious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). The first case

was identified in Wuhan, China, in December 2019. It has since spread worldwide, leading to an ongoing pandemic.

Symptoms of COVID-19 are variable, but often include fever, cough, fatigue, breathing difficulties, and loss of smell and taste. Symptoms begin one to 14 days after exposure to the virus. It is said that around one in five infected individuals do not develop any symptoms.



In Nigeria, the first case of covid-19 was discovered in February last year, and thereafter, according to the federal ministry of Health, the country has recorded 1382 deaths, with 103,999 reported cases. While 82,555 cases have been discharged, all states of the federation and the Federal Capital Territory have all reported cases. While government has been

enforcing measures to check the

spread of the virus, one area of concern is how people commute in public transport.

Government had insisted that all passengers must wear face mask to minimise the risk of being infected or infecting others. However, we have observed that many passengers do not comply. While passengers who patronize

air transportation large comply especially while in the airports and on board, we observe that

passengers using public road transportation,

hardly comply. It seems the law enforcement agents have been overwhelmed and flash enforcements, especially in Lagos and Abuja, have made very little or no meaningful impact. Even the distancing in public buses as advocated by government is no more respected by bus operators. We call on state and federal


governments to heighten the efforts in public awareness campaigns, to continuously educate and enlighten the masses on the dangers associated with non-adherence to covid-19 safety guidelines.

#### New real-time Tyre monitoring System enhances Safety

utomotive and truck parts manufacturer, Bridgestone in collaboration with technology company Microsoft has developed a unique and innovative monitoring system to detect tyre damage issues in real-time.

Bridgestone Europe, Russia, Middle East, India and Africa (EMIA) CEO and President, Laurent Dartoux says damaged tyres can either directly lead to accidents or adversely affect other components of a vehicle which could result in an accident.

According to the Global Auto Tyre Market 2018 report published by market research firm Global Marketers, in September 2018, 30 per cent of all accidents are caused by technical failure.

## Michelin to connect all its Car Tyres by 2023

ichelin has announced it will incorporate Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) chips into all its car tyres by 2023.

The manufacturer said RFID technology is a cost-effective way of

tracking tyres and a 'significant contributor' to predictive maintenance services.

It will also enhance driver safety by allowing Advanced Driver Assistance Systems (ADAS) such as ESP to adjust responses according to specific tyre characteristics, says Michelin.

Michael Ewert, vice president of Global Sales for Original Equipment at Michelin, said: "Since RFID technology ensures this exact tyre identification, it is conceivable in the future that drivers will see a tyre status display next to their fuel gauge. "RFID in tyres makes many new business models possible and can also further increase safety when driving. We are convinced it represents a significant step forward in the tyre industry."

## Korean made eco-friendly Bullet Train launched

Korean-made low-carbon and eco-friendly high-speed train has been launched with the name KTX-Eum. The Korea Railroad Corp. said the new train on Jan. 5 left on its first trip on the route connecting Cheongnyangni Station in Seoul and Andong, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, in line with the opening of the WonjuJecheon Electrified Double Line. Track The KTX-Eum is the first domestically made high-speed electric train featuring self-propelled carriages. It can accommodate more passengers because it needs no locomotive and can add or reduce speed in short distances. Because the train is powered by electricity, it emits no fine dust and its CO2 emissions are just 70% of those of diesel-powered trains and 15% of those of passenger cars.

The new train needs just over two hours to get to Andong from Cheongnyangni Station in Seoul, far faster than the previous time of three hours and 54 minutes. This greatly improves accessibility between the Seoul metropolitan area and the country's central region.



With a top speed of 260 km per hour, the new train from Seoul takes an hour and eight minutes to get to Jecheon, Chungcheongbuk-do Province, an hour and 45 minutes to Yeongju, Gyeongsangbuk-do Province, and two hours and three m i n u t e s t o A n d o n g.

President Moon Jae-in on Jan. 4 visited Wonju Station in Wonju, Gangwon-do Province, to ride the train a day before its official launch. Praising the new train, he said, "If roads were the arteries of our economic development in the 20th century, railroads constitute the main arteries of economic and social

advancement in the 21st century."

'The force, which spearheads the grand transformation of our daily lives and supports implementation of the Green, Digital and Regionally Balanced New Deals, emanates from the railroad as well."

#### FG signs USD1.959b Kano-Maradi Railway Line Project

he Federal Government in its bid to link the whole country by rail, has signed the Memorandum of Understanding with Mota- Engil Group on the construction of US\$1.959 billion Kano-Maradi Standard Gauge Railway lines.

In a statement made available to Transport Day in Abuja, the Minister of Transportation, Rt. Hon. Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi signed on behalf of the Federal Government while the Managing Director, Mota- Engil, Antonio Gvoea signed on behalf of the contracting firm.

The new railway corridor which is to be located in northern Nigeria will run through three states: Kano, Jigawa and Katsina and through Niger territory as far as Maradi. Other cities that will be affected by the rail line in Nigeria are: Danbatta, Kazaure, Daura, Mashi, Katsina and Jibiya. The 283.750 kilometre rail line, besides developing freight and passenger transport as it will be integrated with road transport, will make a great contribution to the local economy as well as an important development in the social sector.

The project duration is for 36 months and the contract type is Engineering, Procurement and Construction. The signing ceremony was witnessed by the Permanent Secretary, Federal

Ministry of Transportation, Dr. Magdalene Ajani and the Director, Legal Services, Pius Oteh.

Managing Director of NRC, Fidet Okhiria, said "The essence of this eticketing is to enable people to access tickets easily with fewer hurdles and especially during this period of social distancing due to the COVID-19 pandemic."

According to Okhiria, the e-ticketing platform will guarantee orderliness in purchasing of tickets and address some major security challenges in the

He said that the e-ticketing would also ensure that the database of all passengers boarding the train were captured in case of emergencies and for other purposes.

## Why Lagos-Ibadan Rail commissioning is delayed-Amaechi



he Minister of Transportation, Rt. Hon. Chibuike Rotimi Amaechi, has said that the commissioning of the Lagos-Ibadan rail line would be put on hold due to the upsurge of Covid19 in the country. Amaechi disclosed this at a Television Interview in Abuja recently.

According to him, over 60 staff on project site have been infected by Covid19 while trying to complete the project. "First let us admit that over 60 of our staff, not ministry of transport staff, but the staff working on the rail project have been infected by Covid, luckily nobody has died and I pray nobody will die, but you

see the kind of sacrifice everybody is making to get the rail to function.

"They are people sacrificing their lives to get to that point, we are of the view when we made that decision that Nigeria will not say 2020 was a bad year, so remove one year and add a nother year to Buhari administration.

"As far as we are concerned, we need to learn how to leave with Covid, I really want to congratulate those that achieve that feat, we were to inaugurate first week in January. We had to stop those doing minor completion because of the rise in Covid transmission."

Coscharis Motors is offering customers the options of 1.0 to 2.5-litre engines across the models.

Another news maker during the year was Mikano Motors. Over the years,

this company has made a name in the power industry, and according to the company's officials, it has expanded business and the auto industry is one of the targets.

The company recently established an auto assembly line at Kamareh city, along the ever busy Lagos-Sagamu expressway for the assembly of Geely models. And only recently, it engaged some of the models on Test Drive, witnessed by auto journalists.



## Protect yourself and others from COVID-19

f COVID-19 is spreading in your Lcommunity, stay safe by taking some simple precautions, such as physical distancing, wearing a mask, keeping rooms well ventilated, avoiding crowds, cleaning your hands, and coughing into a bent elbow or tissue. Check local advice where you live and work. Do it all!

What to do to keep yourself and others safe from COVID-19

Maintain at least a 1-metre distance between yourself and others to reduce your risk of infection when they cough, sneeze or speak. Maintain an even greater distance between yourself and others when indoors. The further away, the better.

M a k e wearing a mask a normal part of being around other people.

The appropriate use, storage and cleaning or disposal are essential to make masks as effective as possible.

Here are the basics of <u>how to wear a</u> mask:

Clean your hands before you put your mask on, as well as before and after you take it off, and after you touch it at any time.

Make sure it covers both your nose, mouth and chin.


When you take off a mask, store it in a clean plastic bag, and every day either wash it if it's a fabric mask, or dispose of a medical mask in a trash bin.

Don't use masks with valves.

How to make your environment safer

Avoid the 3Cs: spaces that are <u>closed</u>, <u>crowded or involve close</u> contact.

Outbreaks have been reported in restaurants, choir practices, fitness classes, nightclubs, offices and places of worship where people have gathered, often in crowded indoor settings where they talk loudly, shout,



breathe heavily or sing.

OVID-19 are higher in crowded and inadequately ventilated spaces where infected people spend long periods of time together in close proximity. These environments are where the virus appears to spread by respiratory droplets or aerosols more efficiently, so taking precautions is even more important.

Meet people outside. Outdoor gatherings are safer than indoor ones, particularly if indoor spaces are small and without outdoor air coming in.

Avoid crowded or indoor settings but if you can't, then take precautions:

**Open a window.** *Increase the amount of* 'natural ventilation' when indoors.

O WHO has published Q&As on ventilation and air conditioning for both the general public and people who manage public spaces and buildings.

o Wear a mask (see above for more details).

Don't forget the basics of good

hygiene

Regularly and thoroughly clean your hands with an alcoholbased hand rub or wash them with soap and water. This eliminates germs including viruses that may be on your hands.

Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Hands touch many surfaces and can pick up viruses. Once contaminated, hands can transfer the virus to your eyes, nose or mouth. From there, the virus can enter your body and infect you.

Cover your mouth and nose with your bent elbow or tissue when you cough or sneeze. Then dispose of the used tissue immediately into a closed bin and wash your hands. By following good 'respiratory hygiene', you protect the people around you from viruses, which cause colds, flu and COVID-19.

Clean and disinfect surfaces frequently especially those which are regularly touched, such as door handles, faucets and phone screens.

What to do if you feel unwell

Know the full range of symptoms of COVID-19. The most

common symptoms of COVID-19 are fever, dry cough, and tiredness. Other symptoms that are less common and may affect some patients include loss of taste or smell, aches and pains, headache, sore throat, nasal congestion, red eyes, diarrhoea, or a skin rash.

Stay home and self-isolate even if you have minor symptoms such as cough, headache, mild fever, until you recover. Call your health care provider or hotline for advice. Have someone bring you supplies. If you need to leave your house or have someone near you, wear a medical mask to avoid infecting others.

If you have a fever, cough and difficulty breathing, seek medical attention immediately. Call by telephone first, if you can and follow the directions of your local health authority.

Keep up to date on the latest information from trusted sources, such as WHO or your local and national health authorities. Local and national authorities and public health units are best placed to advise on what people in your area should be doing to protect themselves.

### New Initiative: German Automotive Industry intensifies links to Africa

he German automotive industry sees potential in Africa and strengthens its ties to the continent. The German Association of the Automotive Industry (VDA) joined hands with the African Association of Automotive Manufacturers (AAAM) as part of the "PartnerAfrica" project of the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). AAAM is the first Automotive association with a pan-African approach, established in 2015 by global Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs).

The partnership-based cooperation between VDA and AAAM is mutually beneficial: in cooperation with local and regional structures it helps the automotive industry to improve access to sometimes difficult markets and at the same time it is in the interest of German development policy to improve local prospects by involving the private sector and to create sustainable jobs and sustainable mobility in partner countries.

The VDA-AAAM partnership sees itself as an engine for dynamic growth, high innovation speed and state-of-the-art jobs.

For the VDA, cooperation with Africa focuses on the following priorities: expanding the sustainability strategy beyond products and production to include energy sources, such as efuels, and digital mobility solutions. In addition, strengthening the development partnership, increasing trade volume and investment, and further opening market access for manufacturers and suppliers. Equally important is supporting the development of local supply and value chains. In addition to stakeholder management and partnerships, topics such as promoting training and employment are also part of the comprehensive program.

Hildegard Müller, President of the VDA, said: "We highly appreciate our partnership with AAAM as the VDA intends to increase its involvement in Africa. With the joint project, VDA and AAAM are pursuing the goal of creating improved conditions for a flourishing automotive industry on the African continent, in order to increase economic growth and welfare in Africa and enable German as well as African member companies to participate in market growth and foster win-win trade and investments between Europe and Africa. This commitment of the VDA and AAAM is a significant contribution to growth and prosperity in Africa, supported by the investments of car manufacturers and suppliers on this



emerging continent." An in-house cluster for the association partnership at VDA's headquarters in Berlin and two project offices in South Africa and Ghana are now responsible for project implementation and supporting direct local contacts for members and partners.

Africa has in some countries fast growing economies with a young, growing population and rapid rates of urbanization along with very low rates of motorization. By 2035, the continent is expected to have the largest labour force potential in the world<sup>1</sup>. The automotive and logistics sector holds a key position due to its sustainable value creation in supplier networks, assembly plants,

distribution structures and pan-African trade relations. And it offers great potential for innovation, growth and jobs. The motorization rate in Africa is just 45 vehicles per 1,000 inhabitants, which is significantly below the global average of 203 per 1,000.

In 2019, the total volume of new vehicles sold in the African market (passenger cars) was 869,000 vehicles. Africa has great potential as a market and production location for the German automotive industry. In 2019, 62,000 passenger cars were exported from Germany to Africa. 49 percent of these went to South Africa, the most important market in

In 2019, 355,000 passenger cars

were sold in South Africa, with German OEMs accounting for 34 percent or 119,000 cars.

Total passenger car production in Africa in 2019 was around 787,000 units. 44 percent of the total car production in Africa took place with 349,000 units in South Africa. German OEMs have steadily expanded their production in South Africa in recent years. Compared to 2010, their production has increased by 44 percent to 317,000 passenger cars in 2019. This means that 91 percent of passenger car production in South Africa is carried out by German manufacturers.

For the German automotive industry, Africa is becoming more and more important not only as an export destination, but also as a local production site: In recent years, German automotive manufacturers and suppliers have made increasing investments not only in the established markets of the Mahgreb region and South Africa, but also in future markets such as Ghana and Rwanda.

The German automotive industry is globally connected. With over 2,500 production facilities abroad, German manufacturers and suppliers contribute to growth and prosperity in over 70 countries around the world. At the same time, the companies use their know-how to contribute to sustainable mobility with environmentally friendly technologies on site.

The untapped demand from Africa is coupled with a steady rise in consumer spending, which has risen over the past few years at an annual rate of 10 percent. The estimated sales forecast of new light vehicles in Africa will be 1.8 million in 2027. This is a doubling compared to the market volume of 2019. Dave Coffey, CEO of AAAM: "Our experts estimate that the African new-vehicle market can initially grow

to 3 million by 2035, with the potential of 5m, by implementing effective automotive policies and ecosystems. We are excited about our partnership with the VDA as it will provide expertise, resources and a strong network that will facilitate the development of the automotive industry in Africa."

VDA and AAAM strongly support the industrialization on the African continent by sharing their industry knowledge, by creating platforms for exchange and by building bridges between countries and between public and private institutions. Furthermore, Africa is expected to play an increasing role in producing and exporting renewable energy. Therefore, a reliable trade framework between Africa and Europe is needed. Also, within Africa trade relations should be eased and intensified.

Roger Brown, Chief Executive of Seplat, said: "We are delighted to sign this Crude Purchase Agreement with Waltersmith as it ensures that Nigerian crude will be refined locally by a Nigerian refiner. The agreement will eliminate losses we previously experienced on the export pipeline,



### 'Nigeria needs \$4b Annually for Renewable Energy'

he minister of state power sector require \$4 Billion annually to universally access clean and renewable energy for a sustained power supply to consumers in the country.

Speaking at a virtual Global power sector players conference presided over by the United Nations Secretary General His Excellency Antonio Guternes, the minister outlined the



achievements and challenges President Muhammadu Buhari administration has recorded in the power sector, saying the government is desirous of ensuring that there is adequate supply of electricity to consumers.

"Our ambition is demonstrated by the recent removal of the fuel subsidy in Nigeria which now make the off-grid sector more competitive, as well as the 5 million solar connections Programe which was included in the Covid 19 recovery strategy, Economic Sustainability Plan ESP."

While urging global partners to support ESP, introduced by the Federal Government, the minister stressed that Nigeria is taking steps to merge its energy access and energy transition conversations as the largest unelectrified population globally resides within the borders, arguing that it is important to give access to the unelectrified 85 million people using renewable sources to maintain Nigeria and Africa's low contribution to carbon emission.

Earlier, the UN secretary General Antonio Gluternes noted that African countries and the global trend for power sector development is clean and renewable energy to unbundle the usual grid supply which has been insufficient over the years especially in African countries considering the huge amounts of fund required to fund sustained supply of power.

According to him, the United Nations is prepared to give necessary support to Nigeria considering the position paper presented by the minister of state power Goddy Jeddy Agba at the conference.

### NIMASA boss pledges to promote Maritime Education

he Director-General of Nigerian Maritime Administration and Safety Agency (NIMASA), Dr. Bashir Jamoh, has promised to prioritise maritime education and professionalism in the transport sector,

Jamoh made this pledge while he was inaugurated as Chairman, Governing Board of the Centre for Logistics and Transport Studies (CELTRAS), University of Port Harcourt (UNIPORT).

The inauguration, which held at the university's Institute of Petroleum Studies Auditorium, was supervised by the acting Vice-Chancellor of UNIPORT, Professor Stephen Okodudu. It had in attendance many academic and non-academic staff.

Jamoh's investiture follows his appointment in October as Chairman of the 10-member Governing Board of CELTRAS. Okodudu had said Jamoh was chosen by virtue of his position as Director-General of NIMASA, emphasising that his appointment "is an eloquent testimony to your outstanding contributions to national development."

In his remarks after the inauguration of the Board, the NIMASA boss, who holds a doctorate in Logistics and Transport Management from the University of Port Harcourt, said he



felt honoured "to lead this great team towards the accomplishment of the noble mission and objectives of the Centre for Logistics and Transport Studies."

He said: "NIMASA, on its part, has a mandate enshrined in its enabling Act, which includes maritime education. It would be all hands on deck and, hopefully, we shall achieve the mandate of maritime education and professionalism in the country." With the inauguration of the CELTRAS Board coming at a time when the Federal Government is

trying to improve and expand the transportation infrastructure across the country, Jamoh said the Centre had its work cut out.

"Without professional transporters in our sector, this infrastructure will continue to dilapidated," the Director-General said. "Therefore, it is not by accident that we are gathered here to inaugurate this board to ensure that we produce professionals, and encourage research towards the development of the transportation sector," he added.

## Lagos increases Boat fleet



o demonstrate its commitment to multimodal transport system, Lagos State Government has urged residents to embrace the unlimited possibilities in water transportation to ease the persistent gridlock in the state.

The Managing Director, Lagos Ferry Services (LAGFERRY), Abdoulbaq Ladi Balogun, appealed in his new year message to commuters while

mapping out LAGFERRY's operational strategies for the year 2021. He promised that Lagosians would witness sweeping transformations in a t e r transportation in the year.

He disclosed that arrangements have been concluded by the State Government to increase the boat fleet to 20 this year.

Balogun assured that his agency would reciprocate the government's huge investment in water transportation with improved and efficient service delivery in the year. The LAGFERRY boss urged Lagosians to consider water transportation as a veritable alternative mode that is fast, seamless, safe and reliable. He added that the first quarter of the new year would witness a lot of transformation in water transportation operations in the state. "I urge you to stay tuned and expect remarkable strides in water transportation in the first quarter of the year as the agency takes delivery of additional world-class boats to increase our fleet to 20 and boost our capacity to meet the ever-increasing demand," Balogun stated.

he National President of Nigerian Merchant Navy Officers and Water Transport Senior Staff Association (NMNOWTSSA), Comrade Bob Yousou, has lamented abandonment, repatriation, insecurity, unpaid wages and poor remuneration as challenges facing the Nigerian seafarers.

Yousou, who disclosed this at the commissioning of its newly acquired national secretariat in Apapa Lagos, said the hazardous nature of seafaring is worth appreciating, but the nation's seafarers are maltreated and poorly remunerated by employers due to lack of Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) and sense of belonging to the right union.

"I want to urge the seafarers' employers to always look at the plight of Nigerian seafarers by not owing them their wages, but pay as at when due. The hazardous nature of seafaring is worth appreciating. We shall no longer tolerate slavery wages for our seafarers. The International Labour Organisation standard in terms of decent working conditions must be applied," he said.

Yousou also decried the proliferation of fake certification by some groups but reaffirmed that the union will continue to fight for the protection of seafarers' with the right certification.

#### **'CBN's Pre-Export** Requirements **Creating Bottlenecks'**

igerian exporters have kicked against the pre-export requirements newly introduced by the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN), saying the procedure is frustrating export of goods from the country to other nations.

In a statement, the umbrella body of the exporters, Network of Practicing Non-oil Exporters of Nigeria (NPNEN), said the apex bank's demand of electronic Export Proceed Form from exporters has brought about huge setback.

According to the President of NPNEN, Ahmed Rabiu, the new procedure has so many layers of activities that often led to delays and loss of income on the part of exporters. "We acknowledge the CBN's desire to

ensure that all exports out of Nigeria are documented in order to ensure that the proceeds of such exports are repatriated, however, the reality on the field shows that the process is causing undue delays and consequently, encouraging corruption."

Under the new pre-export requirements regime, the CBN requires export transactions to be initiated through electronic processing on the trade monitoring system (eNXP) before the preshipment inspection agent, the Nigeria Customs Service and other designated government agencies would then do the pre-export inspections.

The exporters called for immediate reversal of the process while referring to a recent report that about N868bn worth of goods bound for export are currently stranded at the Nigerian ports owing to the new procedure.

"For example, for the PIA to issue the CCI, the exporter is required to upload a certificate of origin as one of the supporting documents for the eNXP, the PIA is also required to upload the CCI to the TRMS(M) and until this is done, the Customs service will not issue the Single Good Declaration," Rabiu said.

### Elon Musk's six secrets to business success

What are the secrets behind Elon Musk's astonishing business success?

Elon Musk has just become the richest person in the world, overtaking Amazon founder Jeff Bezos.

The Tesla and SpaceX entrepreneur's **net worth has crossed \$185bn (£136bn)** after an increase in the share price of the electric car company.

So, what is the secret of his success? A few years back I spent almost an hour discussing exactly this with him. To mark his new

milestone we decided to dust the interview off and share it with you. So here is Elon Musk's guide to success in business.

#### 1. It isn't about the money

This is absolutely central to Elon Musk's attitude to business.

When I interviewed him in 2014 he said he didn't know how rich he was.

"It's not as if there is a pile of cash somewhere," he said. "It's really just that I have a certain number of votes in Tesla, and SpaceX, and SolarCity, and the marketplace has value on those votes."

He doesn't have anything against the pursuit of wealth "if it's done in sort of an ethical and good manner", but said it just isn't what drives him.

The approach certainly seems to be working.

The real-life inspiration for Robert Downey Jr's portrayal of Tony Stark of Iron Man fame was worth perhaps \$10bn when we spoke in 2014.

His electric car company, Tesla, has performed particularly well. Shares have surged over the past year to take its value to more than \$700bn. For that you could buy Ford, General Motors, BMW, Volkswagen and Fiat Chrysler, and still have enough left over to buy Ferrari

But Musk, who turns 50 this year, doesn't expect to die rich. He said he thinks most of his money will be spent building a base on Mars, and wouldn't be surprised if the project consumed his entire fortune.

In fact, like Bill Gates, he would probably regard ending his life with billions in the bank as a mark of failure because he hadn't put that money to good use.

#### 2. Pursue your passions

That Mars base is a clue to what Elon Musk believes is the key to success.

"You want things in the future to be better," he told me. "You want these new exciting things that make life better."



Take SpaceX. He told me he set the company up because he was frustrated the US space programme wasn't more ambitious.

"I kept expecting us to advance beyond Earth, and to put a person on Mars, and have a base on the moon, and have, you know, very frequent flights to orbit," he said.

When that didn't happen, he came up with the idea for the "Mars Oasis Mission", which aimed to send a small greenhouse to the red planet. The idea was to get people excited about space again, and persuade the US government to increase Nasa's budget.

It was while he was trying to get that off the ground he realised the problem wasn't "a lack of will, but rather a lack of way" - space technology was far more expensive than it needed to be.

Et voila! The world's cheapest rocket-launching business was born.

And here's the important thing, its genesis wasn't about making money, but landing a person on Mars.

Musk told me he regards himself as an engineer rather than an investor, and says what gets him up in the morning is the desire to solve technical problems.

It is that, rather than dollars in the bank, that is his yardstick of progress. He knows every hurdle his businesses overcome helps everyone else who's trying to solve the same problem - and it does it forever.

That's why, shortly before we met, the entrepreneur had announced he was going to **open up all Tesla's patents** to speed up the development of electric vehicles worldwide.

#### 3. Don't be afraid to think big

One of the really striking things about Elon Musk's businesses is how audacious they are.

He wants to revolutionise the car

industry, colonise Mars, build superfast trains in vacuum tunnels, integrate AI into human brains and upend the solar power and battery industries.

There's a common thread here. All of his projects are the kind of futuristic fantasies you'd find in a kid's magazine in the early 1980s.

Put it like this, his tunnelling business is called The Boring Company.

Musk makes no secret of the fact he was inspired by the books and movies he consumed as a kid in South Africa.

Which brings us to Musk's third business tip - don't hold back.

He believes low ambition is baked into most companies' incentive structures.

Too many companies are "incrementalist", he said. "If you're the CEO of a big company and you aim for something that's a modest improvement, and it takes longer than expected, and doesn't work out quite as well, then nobody's gonna blame you," he told me. You can say it wasn't my fault, it was the suppliers.

If you are bold, and go for a really breakthrough improvement, and it doesn't work, you're definitely going to get fired, he argues. He says this is why most companies focus on making small improvements to their existing products rather than daring to imagine completely new ones.

So, his advice is to make sure you are working on what he calls "stuff that's going to matter".

Two things stand out in Musk's personal hierarchy of stuff that matters.

First, he wants to accelerate the transition from fossil fuels.

Here's what the entrepreneur had to say about that: "We're drawing upon deep gas fields and deep oil fields that haven't seen the light of day since the Cambrian era. If the last time something saw light was when the most complex organism was a sponge, you really have to question whether that is a wise move." Second, he wants to ensure the long-term survival of humanity by colonising Mars and "making life multiplanetary".

Like I say, think big.

#### 4. Be ready to take risks

This one is obvious.

You've got to have skin in the game to do well, but Elon Musk has taken more risks

than most.

By 2002 he had sold off his holdings in his first two ventures, an internet city guide called Zip2 and the online payment company PayPal. He had just entered his 30s and had almost \$200m in the bank.

He says his plan was to put half his fortune into the businesses and keep the other half.

Things didn't work out like that. When I met him, he was just emerging from the darkest period of his business life. His new companies faced all sorts of teething troubles. SpaceX's first three launches had failed, and Tesla had all manner of production problems, and supply chain, and design issues.

Then the financial crisis struck.

Musk said he faced a stark choice. "I could either keep the money, then the companies are definitely going to die, or invest what I have left and maybe there is a chance."

He kept pouring in money.

At one point he was so in debt he had to borrow money from friends just to pay his living expenses, he told me.

So, did the prospect of bankruptcy frighten him?

He says it didn't: "My kids might have to go to a sort of government school. I mean big deal, I went to a government school."

#### 5. Ignore the critics

What really shocked him - and it was clear in 2014 he was still very upset by it - was the delight many pundits and commentators took in his travails.

"The liberal schadenfreude was really quite astonishing," said Musk. "There were multiple blog sites maintaining a Tesla death watch."

I suggested people may have wanted him to fail because there's a kind of arrogance about his ambition.

He rejected that. "I think it would be arrogant if we said we were definitely going to do it, as opposed to we're aspiring to do it, and we're going to give it our best shot."
